Public Health – Seattle & King County is working on a community-based participatory model building project focused on heat health risks in the City of Auburn. We have established a 15-person workgroup of people with related lived and professional experiences that have created a model that visualizes how heat impacts health in Auburn. This workgroup has met three times since July 2024 and will meet three more times before April 2025 to finish the model and identify solutions to be shared with decisionmakers.


Mayor's Open House in early December - Anyone on AJCC can attend, anyone on a board or commission, city employee, or resident can attend.
